
In the beginning Boronia School 4081 was located in Dorset Road. Where Boronia McDonalds now stands.


The Boronia School is located in Dorset Road, opposite Chandler Road and the Boronia Railway Station















Inside the original classroom on Dorset Road in 1923.







CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT

In 2002 fire destroyed our historic hall, The George Maddocks Cultural Centre. This hall had originally been built in 1955 with funding from the Government and contributions from the Boronia Primary School community through fundraising and voluntary labour.

With that same passion and community spirit, the Boronia Primary School community came together under the leadership of Assistant Principal, Rob Bates to create the 'Working for the Future' Committee, whose purpose was to again raise the funds required to supplement government funding to build a new stadium.

Rob's enthusiasm, motivation and humour led a core of dedicated parents to take on an immense fundraising task.

Mr Les Dalton (a parent), presented the idea for the Extreme Machine Show, a massive and extremely successful undertaking, which became the major fundraiser in 2004 and 2005. In conjunction with two golf days and sausage sizzles, the Working for the Future team, with the support and assistance of the Boronia Primary School staff and community, has raised over \$90,000.

Rob Bates' foresight and commitment to raise funds for this facility is where his legacy will benefit the Boronia Primary School for generations.

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT

In 2002 fire destroyed our historical hall, built in 1955 with contributions from both Government and the Boronia Primary School community. When rebuilding, Boronia Primary School Council decided that, to improve the facilities and programs at the school, they would provide additional facilities to the new hall/stadium including internal toilets, a uniform shop, kitchen, furniture storage area and P.E. storage area. The cost greatly exceeded available funds so School Council decided to borrow the extra funds through a Cooperative Loan. To borrow the required \$150,000, at least one hundred and eleven people were needed to step forward to become members. Without these shareholders, we would not have this wonderful facility.








In 2012 **Boronia Primary School** became Boronia K-12 College with the merging of Boronia Primary School, **Allandale Kinder and Boronia Heights College**
